Department of Psychiatry F.H. Medical College, Agra

The department of psychiatry in F.H. Medical College (FHMC) is a separate department working for more than 5 years. The department has two consultants who work under head of the department of psychiatry who in turn works under dean/principal of the college. I am supervising all the teaching & clinical work in the department. During my tenure as the Head of Psychiatrist Department, FHMC, Agra, following duties were undertaken by me:

- 1. Management of inpatient units (Total patient strength: 15 patients including male, female & child patients distributed in a ward): This included carrying out regular clinical ward discussions, twice weekly ward rounds, one post-OPD evening round for the management of newly admitted patients, and assessment and management of patients with acute and chronic psychiatric illnesses and psychiatric emergencies; also carrying out a weekly chart meeting in which case files of recently discharged patients were reviewed and further management plan was decided. Types of patients included those with substance use disorder, mood disorder, schizophrenia, anxiety disorder, personality disorder, post-partum psychosis, mental retardation, autism and patients with other psychological problems were also seen. Inpatients were evaluated in details, under supervision, especially assessing the high-risk patients (e.g. delirium, suicidal and pregnant female patients) and managing these patients pharmacologically and non-pharmacologically.
- 2. Management of a twice-weekly outpatient clinic: The outpatient attendance ranged from 40-50 follow-up patients and 10-15 new patients. Both pharmacotherapy and psychosocial interventions were used to manage persons with psychiatric disorders.
- 3. Screening of new referrals in outpatient department (OPD) for inpatient treatment and detailed evaluation.

- 4. Referring and liaison with allied mental health professionals, general practitioners, neurologists and other specialists and private psychiatrists.
- 5. Administration of ECT with psychiatry trainees.
- 6. Family meeting, psycho-education and discharge counseling for patient's careers. Psychotherapy and psycho education of patients.
- 7. Training & Teaching of junior resident doctors and under graduate MBBS. students in clinical psychiatry.

Emergency Psychiatry duties were as under (2/week)-

- a. Management of emergency ward and attending the calls from the entire hospital.
- b. Training junior resident doctors in acute emergency care psychiatry
